As we approach Christmas and the New Year, we would like to take a few moments to reflect on how to keep safe during this period and to update you with planning for the start of our COVID vaccination programme.

Firstly the important message is that whilst COVID in the community has been relatively low, compared to other parts of the country, nevertheless it is still circulating and infecting people. We cannot be complacent and need to continue to follow all of the NHS England guidance to protect ourselves and others.

Please maintain social distancing, remember to wear a mask, wash your hands regularly and keep homes well ventilated. Try to maintain, as much as possible, (2m) distancing in the home if you are inviting people into your Christmas bubble, always remembering hands, face, space and fresh air.

LIVI Update

LIVI GPs are all GMC-registered NHS-GPs, who (with your consent) are able to access your medical records and give a considered, in-depth diagnosis based on your medical history. Free of charge, over 1500 of our patients have already signed up for LIVI and the feedback has been very positive. Flu Vaccination Update

Great news, a record 5,000 plus Old Bridge Surgery patients have been vaccinated against the flu this year. If you are eligible and haven't been vaccinated yet, please contact the surgery to book your appointment as soon as possible, especially as we head into January when traditionally flu starts to circulate. With COVID circulating too, protecting the community is critical to ensure that we keep our communities safe and help to reduce the winter pressures on the surgery and the NHS in general.

COVID Vaccination Update

Unfortunately due to the characteristics of the Pfizer vaccine, which restricts transportation across multiple locations across the UK, we are currently unable to administer this vaccine at the surgery. We are however working with 9 local surgeries, part of the East Kernow Primary Care Network (PCN), to set-up COVID clinics in a central location early in the New Year and we will update you as soon as the site (anticipated to be Millenium House, Pensilva) has been approved by NHS England. The first patients to be invited to have their COVID jabs will be patients aged over 80 years, with our eldest patients being invited first. Subsequent age groups will be invited as part of a rolling programme, and the vaccination programme is anticipated to be ongoing for many months, so your patience and understanding is greatly appreciated.
