Reflections

At times like these, we find ourselves reflecting on the enormous sacrifices and support given by our staff who continue to work under unprecedented pressures and are amazing ambassadors for the NHS.

Some notable achievements, include:

- The surgery made the early decision to deliver our covid vaccination programme locally, as we wanted to make the vaccines as accessible as possible, especially as we have one of the highest % of elderly patients across Cornwall.
- In recognition of our determination and commitment, the surgery was repeatedly recognised for delivering the fastest / highest covid percentage uptake across Cornwall.

- Throughout covid we have remained accessible and have seen many patients face to face. Despite being advised that surgeries could suspend monitoring for long term conditions, we also continued to deliver these (where possible) achieving 88% against the suspended target.
- Within a week of launching our 2022/23 covid recall programme last week, we have visited and administered covid vaccinations across all local care homes and have started vaccinating our housebound patients, such is our continued commitment to protect our most vulnerable patients. We also have mass vaccination clinics scheduled at Looe Community Academy, as well as visits to our local pre-schools to deliver the flu vaccines to 2 and 3 year olds.

Of course, we recognise that sometimes frustrations can occur when it takes a little longer to get hold of us, or to get the appointment with the clinician you are seeking. However, we need to be honest. Patient demand is up, GP recruitment is ongoing and we are doing our best under pressurised circumstances, for which (thankfully) most of our patients have been very supportive and appreciative.
