

## Covid & Flu Update – Time to Top-Up

As we head into Autumn, we would like to take this opportunity to share the surgery plans to deliver Covid and Flu vaccines.

## Covid has not gone away

Whilst more recently many patients have experienced milder symptoms, the reality is that some patients are still becoming unwell so vaccinations need 'topping up', especially as immunity is waning.

The hospitals have seen first-hand how the successful vaccination programme has been able to save lives, enabling them to free up beds and re-focus on vital services. Therefore, we should not be complacent and undo this hard work. When invited for a Covid booster/flu vaccination *please* take advantage of it to help protect yourself, your families, our community and the NHS.

## **Priorities**

Over the coming weeks, NHS England have asked surgeries to initially focus on care home residents and staff, as well as housebound patients. Old Bridge Surgery will start these as early as tomorrow.

Our first large scale clinics will take place at Looe Community Academy on Saturday October 1<sup>st</sup>, with further large-scale clinics being held on Saturday October 15<sup>th</sup> and Saturday October 29<sup>th</sup>. These will be supported with some limited smaller clinics at the surgery.

With a team of GPs, Nurses and Healthcare Assistants on hand, and of course the continued support of the Looe Lions, we look forward to seeing as many patients as possible.

If you have recently had a Covid booster, you will need to **wait at least 91 days** for your next Covid booster.
